



OUR HISTORY

1994: The first California IHSS Public Authority is established in San Mateo County.

1995 – 1999: Seven other California Public Authorities are established – San Francisco, Alameda, Contra Costa, Sacramento, Los Angeles, Monterey, Santa Clara

1997: The County of San Diego Board of Supervisors accepted a report recommending that the County establish a Supported Individual Provider (SIP) Registry.

1999: The County establishes the SIP Registry

July 1999: California State Assembly Bill 1682 passes requiring counties to establish an employer of record by January 2003. The Employer of record establishes a formal entity that can negotiate with the County and union for wages, benefits and other terms and conditions of employment. New law also requires the formation of the IHSS Advisory Committee.

May 2000: IHSS Advisory Committee formed by the County of San Diego Board of Supervisors.

June 2000: IHSS Advisory Committee begins. Committee recommends implementing the IHSS Public Authority as employer of record.

July 19, 2001: The County of San Diego IHSS Public Authority is formed by legal ordinance by the County Board of Supervisors.

October 2001: United Domestic Workers of America (UDW) union is chosen by the majority of IHSS Individual Providers to represent San Diego Individual Providers.

December 2001: The IHSS Public Authority Executive Director is hired.

March 2002: The first Interagency Agreement between the County and the IHSS Public Authority is signed and executed by the Board of Supervisors.

March 2002: The IHSS Public Authority and UDW sign the first Memorandum of Agreement (MOA). The IHSS Individual Providers subsequently vote to accept the MOA and also vote for an agency shop, where all IHSS Individual Providers must join and pay dues as members or must pay an agency fee.

July 2002: The IHSS Public Authority takes over the IHSS payroll.

October 2002: The IHSS Public Authority Registry opens.
